Register for the 2010 GaDOE Annual Autism Academy

In response to system requests, the 2010 Autism Academy will provide another in-depth study of autism spectrum disorders and an understanding of needs for students to include a specialization in low functioning and high functioning autism. Intended for educators who are in the classroom, attendees will be provided various strategies,

educational practices and methodologies for students with autism, including classroom set up and district program design.

Selection of attendees should be based on staff dedicated to building capacity within your local system. Additionally, new staff working with ASD students are welcome to attend.

The Autism Academy will be held on June 21 – 24, 2010 at the Rutland Center, 1250 Oglethorpe Avenue, Athens, GA. 30306. There is no charge for registration. Systems will be responsible for all travel, lodging and meals for participants.
